## THE NICENE CREED

Book of Common Prayer 358

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## **MUSIC NOTES**

The prelude this morning is the organ version of the Aria by Flor Peeters (1903-1986). Originally part of Peeters' Sonata for Trumpet and Piano composed in 1943, it was arranged for organ solo, which is how it is now usually heard.

Today's postlude is the last piece in the set of Seven Improvisations by Camille St-Saëns (1835-1921). St.-Saëns composed these pieces (December 1916 – February 1917) while recovering from bronchitis.

St.-Saëns had been the organist of the Madeline in Paris and had resigned in 1878, not touching the organ for many years.
