

Beginning September 8th, there will be a sign up sheet on the bridge so you can claim the role you've always dreamed of!



Our Sunday School program begins at 10:30 am on September 8th. Children will meet in the Sunday School room and join their parents in the service for Communion.



Heritage Foundation

1. <u>INVESTMENT ADVISOR – PNC INSTITUTIONAL ASSET MANAGEMENT – FINANCIAL</u> REPORT BY MYRA VITTO

Just like the 1st Quarter (3-31-2024) Report, Myra outlined the results of the 2nd Quarter (6-30-2024) performance of the PNC administrated Sallie Tod and Hitchcock trusts. Both trusts are in a slow but steady growth mode of about 2.3% per year with 70% equities and 30% fixed return investments with large cap companies preferred.

The Sallie Tod trust provides the Church with annual income of about \$17,136 per year or about \$4,284 quarterly; the Hitchcock trust provides the Church with annual income of about \$14,423 per year or about \$3,606 quarterly.

2. <u>DAVE BULKLEY AND SCOTT ZOLDAN-MORGAN STANLEY REPORT</u>

Dave Bulkley and Scott Zoldan presented the second quarter report. The value of the assets they manage as of 06/30/2024 were \$1,411,568.98. The asset allocation was 61.2% equities or \$864,377; fixed income and preferreds were 24.2% or \$342,260; alternative assets were 10.5% or \$148,063 and cash was 4.0% or \$56,867. The projected twelve month income was \$36,487 or 2.57% annually.

The year-to-date investment earnings were \$81,261 and the cumulative performance of all accounts were up 6.06% year to date and 11.95% in the last twelve months. The accounts were up to \$153,930 in the last twelve months.

The Endowment Board voted, as of Friday August 23, 2024, to reposition 5% of our equity investments to fixed income as recommended by our Advisor(s) Morgan Stanley on the premise that in the next 12-18 months the returns to the Church should be greater than equity investments.
