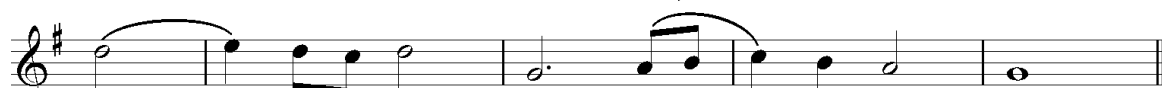

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Book of Common Prayer 292

Celebrant Dear people of God: In Holy Baptism we have become part of that great fellowship of believers in all times and places: the Communion of Saints. In baptism God has adopted us as children and made us members of Christ's body and inheritors of God's kingdom with the saints in light. Let us now renew the vows of our baptism by which God has made us a holy people.

MUSIC NOTES

This morning's prelude is one of the chorale preludes of Bach that was likely composed earlier in his life. It was rare for manuscripts to have dates on them, and in many cases, we only have a piece because someone copied it. The hymn tune that the prelude is based on (see hymnal #421) must have been one of Bach's favorites, as there are more settings of this hymn than any other in his output. This piece is for hands only and at that, in three voices, with the hymn melody being clearly stated in the upper voice.

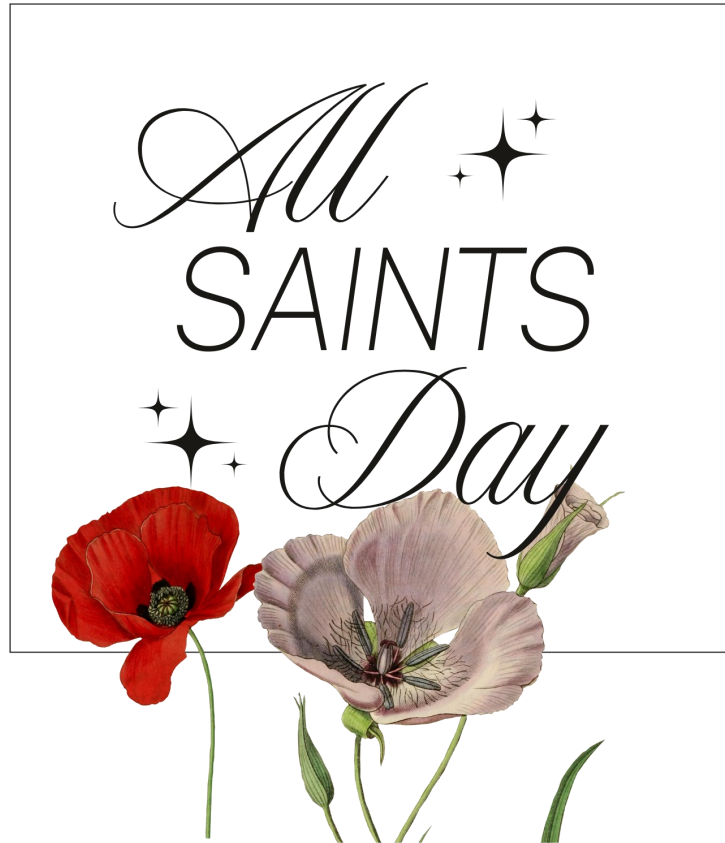

Today's postlude is a chant based work by the French organist and composer, Marcel Dupré. Dupré was the organist for many years at St. Sulpice in Paris, which has the largest pipe organ in France.
