How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy that we feel before our God because of you?

[I Thessalonians 3:9]

Dear people of God at St. John's Episcopal Church,

The words of the Apostle Paul resonate so loudly with me when I think of how fond I've grown of you in my ten months of ministry among you.

And yet, I can't express with greater joy what more still awaits you in the months to come.

The search committee has finally been commissioned and has begun its work in finding a Priest-in-Charge to lead St. John's into the future. There is joy in the anticipation.

We begin a new season and a new liturgical year on December 1, the First Sunday of Advent. In the past several years I've adopted the practice of establishing a theme that will guide my thoughts and prayers for the coming year.

This year I am thinking about "HOPE."

On this first Sunday, we light the candle of Hope on the Advent wreath.

I invite you for the coming year to concentrate with me on that word, *hope*, because it is what pulls us in the direction of what is yet to be.

One of my favorite poets, Emily Dickinson, wrote that:

"Hope" is the thing with feathers—

That perches in the soul—

And sings the tune without the words—

And never stops—at all—

Hope is strong, hope is irrepressible, hope is relentless, hope is undeniable.

We've often heard the expression, "Don't get your hopes up," but that is exactly what hope is for. Hope keeps us turned toward the future.

As we light an additional candle on the wreath in each of the following Sundays of Advent, what we will see developing is our light in the darkness. It is the visible form in which Christ promises to be with us. Make this the mental picture that you carry with you throughout the weeks to come.

It is obviously the symbol of this season of hope, but it is not the only way Christ is with us. Because he also comes to us in the waters of baptism, in the bread and wine we share each Sunday. And as he fills us with hope, he also calls us to be hope to others.

I've mentioned elsewhere that our Gospel readings for the coming year will be taken primarily from the Gospel according to Luke. Luke is also recognized as the author of the book of Acts as well as a physician. His feast day – October 18 – emphasizes the church's ministry of healing by showing concern for all those in the health care profession.

As God's people, we, too, can relieve some of this world's suffering by offering glimpses of the coming Kingdom to others through our witness and our actions.

God calls us, then, to bear the word of hope and healing to a broken world.

May that be our theme for this coming year and beyond.




