Dear people of God at St. John's Episcopal Church,

It is March. We are two months into our year of "Hope and Healing."

March is a hopeful month. After the rather harsh winter that we've experienced we look forward to signs of Spring: warmer temperatures, flowers blooming, and baseball, among others. Yes, hope springs eternal, as the old saying goes.

We also enter the season of Lent, which happens rather late this year.

This has actually worked to our advantage, because it has given us time to plan for the season. Last year, you may recall, I had been among you for just one month, and we had a lot of things – both positive and negative – going on. I compare it to trying to drink from a fire hose. Everything was flying at us fast and furious.

However, this year, we have had the luxury of time, and we look forward to the future with hope!

We have several opportunities to deepen our faith this Lent, and therefore increase our hope.

You'll see a more detailed calendar of our Lenten activities elsewhere on these pages. However, I would like to invite you specifically to our Lenten Bible Study on the Baptismal Promises. We will be using a book titled, *Will You? A Lenten Study of Baptismal Promises,* written by Amanda Perkins McGriff, an Episcopal priest and chaplain at a children's hospital in Memphis, Tennessee.

I chose this book because the tradition of Lent began as a preparation for catechumens, or converts to the Christian faith, who were to be baptized on Holy Saturday, to be united with the death and resurrection of Christ. Their main focus and the basis for their faith, was that Jesus had overcome the power of death, had freed them from their sins, and invited them to enter into a new life which lasted forever.

You may have noted that in the past few weeks, I've mentioned baptism and communion several times in my sermons. They are the two major sacraments of the Church.

However, I feel that those of us who were baptized as infants have not really embraced the full power of its significance for our lives. Hopefully (there's that word again!), this study will help us gain a better understanding of dying to sin in the waters of baptism and the rising to newness of life by God's claim on us through this sacrament.

Beginning on March 6, we will gather in the parlor each Thursday at 12:15 p.m. and share a light meal before moving into An Order of Service for Noonday, and from there, dive into our Lenten study.

In preparation, I encourage you to read the Baptismal Covenant, found on pages 304-305 of the *Book of Common Prayer*, especially, the five "Will you?" questions on which the book is structured and that will guide the conversations each week.

To quote the author, "My prayer is that this book will inspire you to think in new ways about the promises we make to God, to each other, and to ourselves in our baptisms."


I look forward to seeing you and together, explore what God has in store for us this Lenten season.



About the book:

From a fearless, internationally acclaimed activist, *We Will Be Jaguars* is an impassioned memoir about an indigenous childhood, a clash of cultures, and the fight to save the Amazon rainforest and protect her people.

Born into the Waorani tribe of Ecuador's Amazon rainforest- one of the last to be contacted by missionaries in the 1950s - Nemonte Nenquimo had a singular upbringing. She was taught about plant medicines, foraging, oral storytelling, and shamanism by her elders. She played barefoot in the forest and didn't walk on pavement, or see a car, until she was a teenager and left to study with an evangelical missionary group in the city. But after Nemonante's ancestors began appearing in her dreams, pleading with her to return and embrace her own culture, she listened.

Women's Coffee


