



THE THIRD LESSON

John 20:19-31

Lector A reading from John.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said,

"Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

MUSIC NOTES

Our prelude this morning is one of twelve chorale preludes composed by the French organist and teacher, Jeanne Demessieux (1921-1968). As an organist, she had 2500 compositions ready to play from memory and was the first woman organist to sign a recording contract. She was the organist at Saint Esprit for 29 years and then at La Madeleine in Paris at the end of her life.

Today's postlude is the final movement of the second symphony for organ by Charles-Marie Widor (1844-1937) Widor was the organist at St. Sulpice in Paris for most of his career, which was the largest organ in France. Widor was a pioneer in developing the idea of a symphony for the organ and the development of the organ in nineteenth century France made an ideal instrument for this music.
