THE FIRST LESSON

Acts 9:36-43

Lector A reading from Acts.

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they

had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

MUSIC NOTES

The offertory anthem this morning was originally the theme music for the British hit show, The Vicar of Dibley. While the antics of the show highlight so many characteristics of our Anglican nature, the theme song for the show was perfect as each episode begins with an arial view of the British countryside, perfect for Psalm 23. The anthem has a middle section which was never heard on the tv show.

Our prelude and postlude are taken from a collection of pieces known as 24 Pieces in Free Style, by the French organist and composer Louis Vierne (1870-1937). Vierne was a student of Charles-Marie Widor and developed a fairly unique style that fit the acoustics of Notre Dame Cathe-

7 dral in Paris, where he was the organist for many years.
