From the Interim Rector

"Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?!" [Isaiah 43:18-19 NRSV]

Dear people of God at St. John's Episcopal Church,

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

We are well into the Easter season and awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (June 8).

Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Christian Church. However, the Church had been in development since long before then, and it continues to evolve even today.

We read the verse above from the prophet Isaiah on the Fifth Sunday in Lent. As I told you in my sermon that day, making things new or the idea of newness is a concept that is found throughout the entire Bible.

As St. John's moves forward during this interim period, it is worth your while to pause and reflect on just where we are as a church in comparison to a year ago or so, and what may be ahead in the future.

We are different. We are not the same congregation that we were then. And as we move forward, we will continue to change.

As a church, we are called to witness to the love of God for all creatures and all creation.

How do we become those bold, courageous, and faithful witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ?

Since its retreat in March, the Vestry has been diligently working on goals that will help us move in that direction in the coming year.

At the same time, another group has been in conversation with St. James Church in Boardman to explore ways to support each other and discern what a shared ministry between the two might look like.

All the while, our search committee presses on toward the goal of finding that spiritual leader that will serve this community and guide us toward the fulfilling of God's purpose.

But these discussions are not limited to a few. All of you have a stake in this venture.

The question each of you must ask yourself is, "How can I become involved? What is my role in this new thing to which God is calling us?"

No doubt about it. Your participation is vital to the shaping of our congregation's future. But only you can determine what part you will play.

The Church is a community of grace and reconciliation in which everyone has equal right of participation. It's not just up to the Vestry, a small group, the staff, or the Interim Rector.

We all have gifts and capabilities that we don't know about until they are unlocked by a powerful personal experience, like the Holy Spirit.

None of this happens overnight. But it will happen if only we open ourselves to the Spirit and enable it to work within us.

As we move forward toward Pentecost, let us be open to those new things that God is doing in, with, and through us.


Taft Mobile Pantry Tuesday, April 15th, at 1:15pm at the United Way Volunteer Center.

1. June 1st:


